Tools for Building a Domestic Church

"The Christian family ... can and should be called 'the domestic Church"

(Familiaris Consortio, John Paul II, 1981)

Pray as a family – at meals, in the morning or before bed. Find a time that works for your family.

Have a **crucifix** in a prominent place in the home and in every bedroom.

Attend **Mass** as a family.

Start **family traditions** based on the liturgical calendar. Seasons such as Advent, Lent, feast day, all lend themselves to special traditions.

Go to **Mass** even when you are on vacation.

Teach **charity** to your children through your example.

Participate in **social justice** activities as a family. Collect food, help in a soup kitchen, etc.

Demonstrate your **love** for your spouse, your children, your neighbors and your world.

Remind your children that they are **loved by God** and have been given **gifts** to serve others.

Talk freely about God in the joys and in the sorrows of your life.

Welcome and support priests, brothers, sister and lay ministers in the church.

Volunteer at church.

Allow your children to **witness you** in private prayer.

Encourage your kids to **pray daily** on their own, to listen for God's call, and if heard, to responds.

Create a **prayer area** or altar in your house.

Bless your children as they leave the house each day.

Have your **house** blessed.
